CURTIS ELEMENTARY PLAYGROUND UPGRADE

This past year, the Board approved donating \$500 to Curtis Elementary School to help cover the cost of upgrading their playground and adding safety fencing. The total cost was around \$25,000.

Below is an update on that project. [Dave Elswick.]

"I just want to personally thank you all for all you have done over the past two years to help make the playground happen. It is so rewarding to hear the kids talk about how much fun it is when they go out there. It is also very comforting to know for the first time in my 21 years at Curtis that the school grounds are completely enclosed by fencing. Our children's safety is always one of my major concerns. I look back over the past two years and there are so many of you I want to thank for giving your time, your effort and your support to make this huge project happen. It happens to be a lot of small things that enabled us to be successful. Thank you for donating toward this playground project as well as many of you running these projects as well as being a part of the sponsorship program. In my 21 years I am very proud of many accomplishments that have taken place here at Curtis but this one far exceeds them all.

"Please join us on October 3 on the blacktop to dedicate or playground, you were a very big part of this project and I want you to be there for this special event.
