## How Good Were The "Good Old Days"

*Those were the days, my friend . . . the good old days. Or were they? Maybe you'll revise your opinion after reading the Work Rules of a company in the year 1852. Experts say these rules were rather universal in that era. Good old days? Well, judge for yourself as you read the following:*

### Work Rules (1852)

1. All employees must abide by the following regulations: This firm has reduced the hours of work, and the clerical staff will now only have to be present between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.

2. Clothing must be of a sober nature. The clerical staff will not disport themselves in raiment of bright colors.
