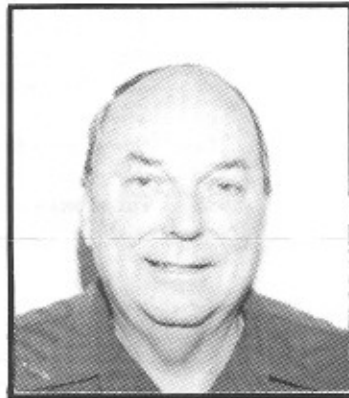

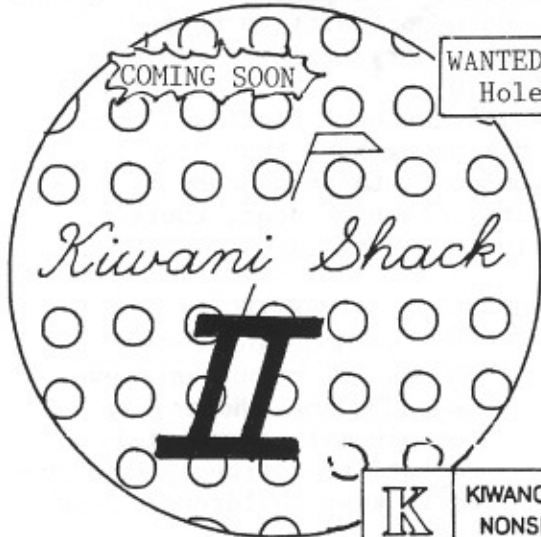

INSTANT REPLAY!

For those of you who missed Richard Nunneley's annual program on Lawn Care:

1. This is the week to apply broadleaf weed killer in liquid form (Weed-B-Gone or Spectrum 33)
2. Also apply pre-emergent crabgrass killer such as Balam or Halts... unless you are re-seeding.
3. Seeding or fertilizing in the spring is not recommended. Do it in the fall (SOD program).
4. Use Diazon on Apr 1 to control the grubs that moles feed on. Poisons do not work.

April 15th is HAZARDOUS WASTE DISPOSAL DAY at Carver Middle School. Dispose of lead base paints, old insecticides, and the like ... free of charge.
