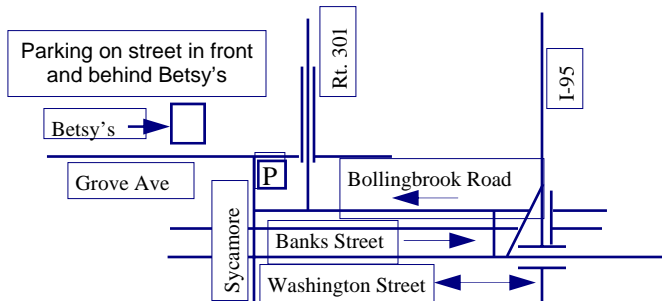
ChesterFest
