President's Message

Well fortunately or unfortunately for years I have functioned best as a mediator, making sure all voices are heard and understood. It is a good principle to live by as an individual or as a club. This year I am going to lead in the manner I know best, work on developing my leadership skills and hope I can earn your respect.

If you were at either the Induction of Officers dinner or at last nights club meeting you heard my goals of cooperation with other clubs/organizations, continued membership growth, and membership retention. I am not going to bore you with further elaboration of these. Needless to say they can't be achieved without every members help. Now let's get down to practical matters such as the results of our October Board Meeting.

President Elect Jay Slagle did a great job in President Steve Castro's absence in chairing the meeting up until we reached the New Business portion when I assumed responsibility. Two important issues were dealt with: 1) the nomination/election of or Club Secretary; and 2) the approval of our club's 2006-2007 budget.

I learned in the Kiwanis Leadership Training I attended that the job of secretary is the most demanding and difficult task in the club. Dr. Joseph Hillier's experience and wealth of knowledge about Kiwanis made him the logical choice for this position. I asked and he agreed to continue in this function for the forthcoming year. His name was put before the board and he was approved unanimously.

President's Message (Cont'd)

In preparation for this board approval I met with members on the preceding Saturday morning and we developed a proposed budget. Following some discussion and education the proposed budget was modified in the following manner: in the Community Service Account under Income we changed New Project from \$1500 to \$1750 and under Expenditures added Chesterfest in the amount of \$250.00 (for a budget that balances at \$15,350); in the Administrative Account under Income we changed Membership dues from \$5850 to \$5590 and under Income we changed In-House Club Event from \$900 to \$1160 (for a budget that balances at \$8, 950).

The center of discussion was a recommendation to discontinue mailing out the monthly news letter except to those individuals who either did not have a internet connection or preferred receiving a newsletter via snail-mail. *The recommendation was accepted.*

A recommendation by Tom Williams that we continue with our existing Website for the forthcoming year was received. He provided an in-depth analysis of the benefits of both our existing vs. an alternative. The possibility that the club may wish to change to a competitive source will be re-evaluated before the 2007-2008 Budget Year.

Again, I look forward to work with all of you in the forthcoming year.
